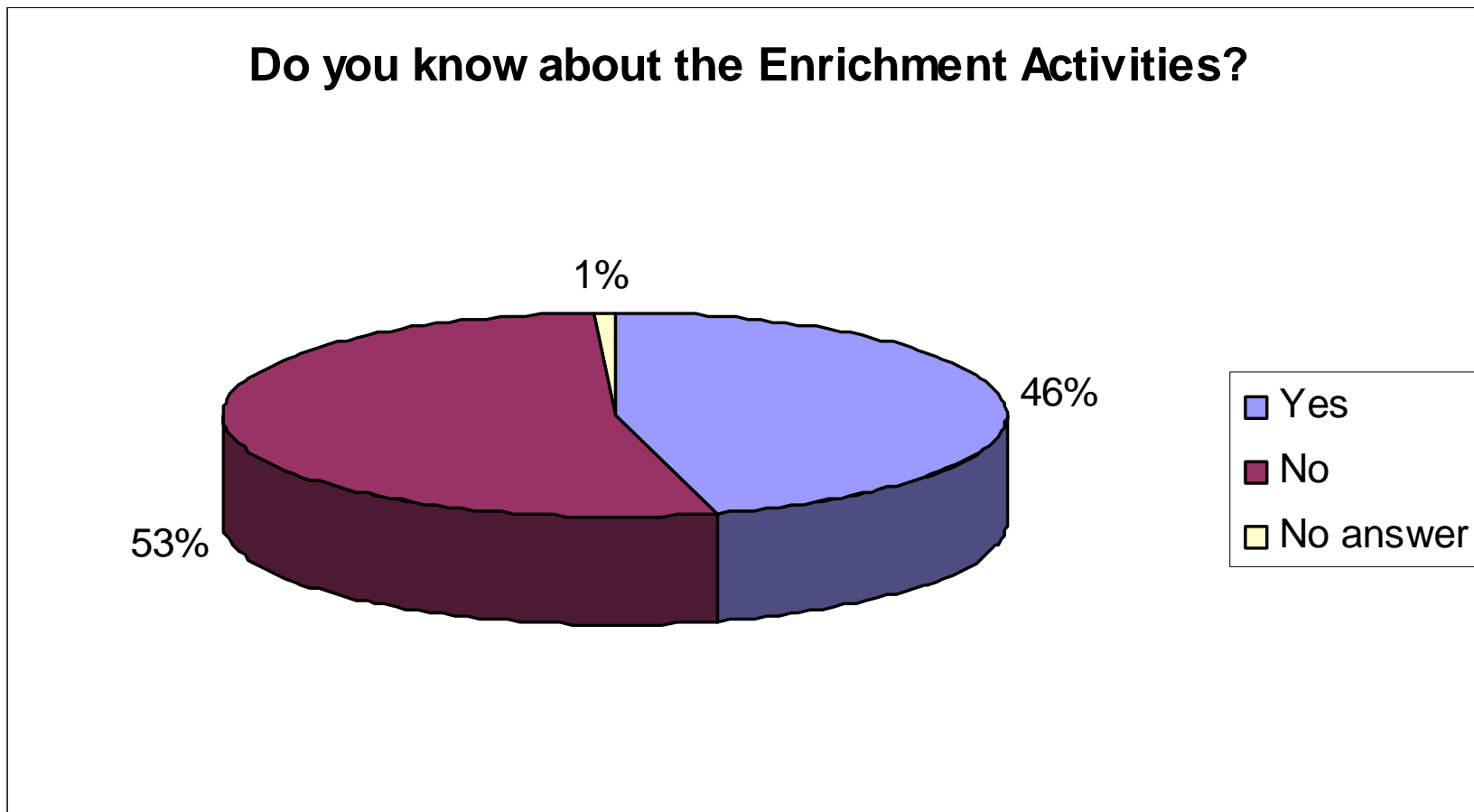


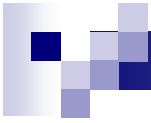
Introduction

- The purpose of conducting the Enrichment Survey was to improve the Enrichment Activities for the Federation Schools. The aims were to discover:
 - what had previously discouraged students from participating;
 - the type of activities students are interested in;
 - how they would like the activities to be organised in the future.
- The Enrichment Survey was completed by students from Broadoak, Priory, Worle, Wyvern and Westhaven Schools.
- 2 tutor groups from each year group were selected to complete the survey.
- The return rates were as follows:

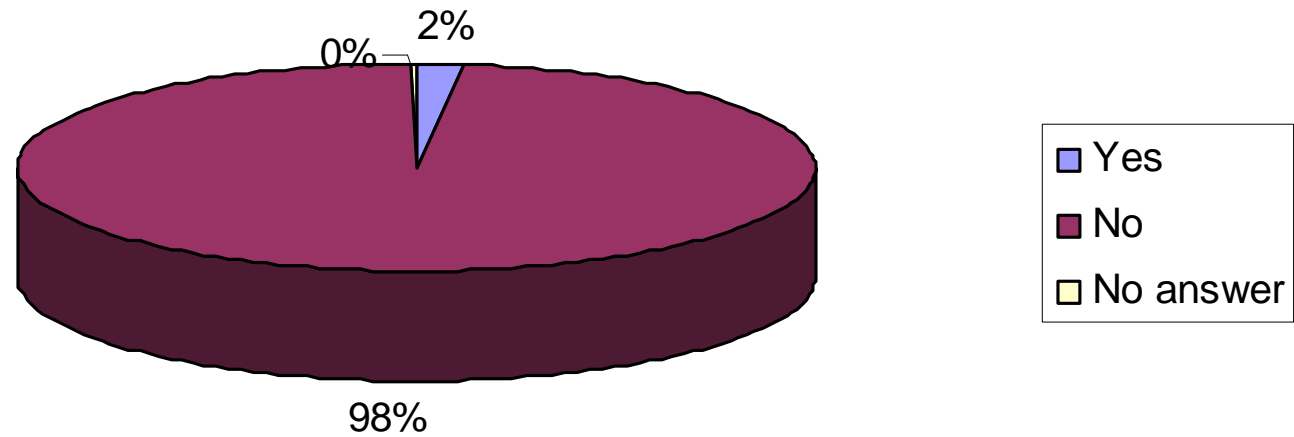

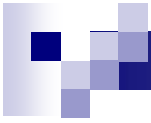
Are you taking part in any of these activities?



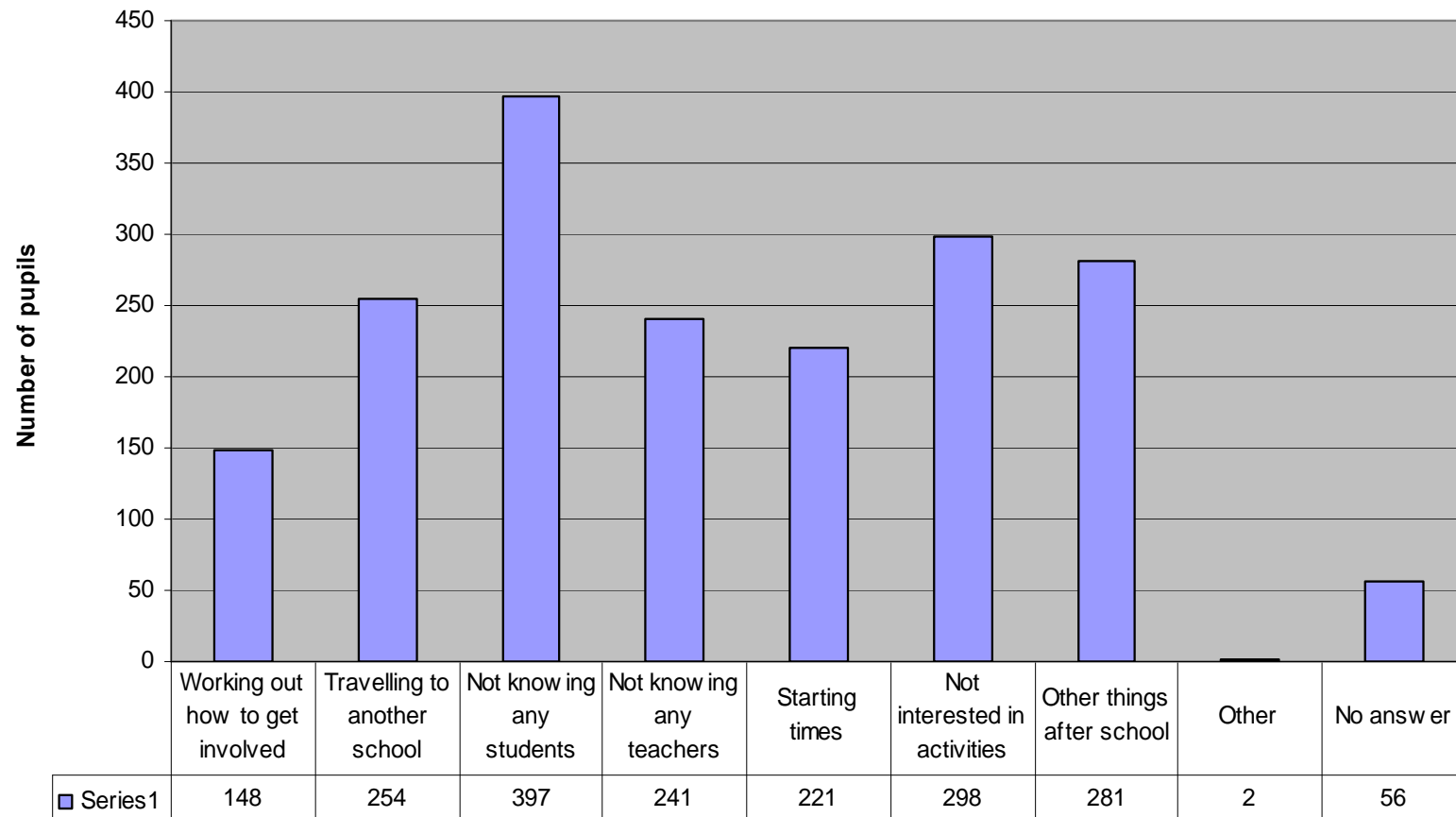

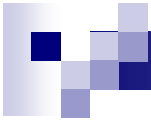

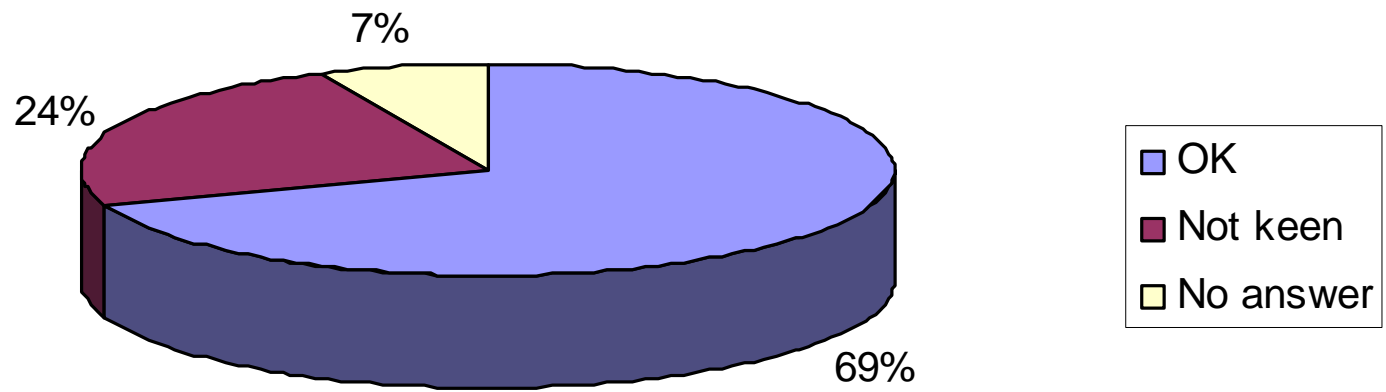


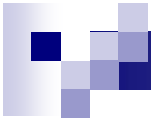
How long would you like the activities to last?



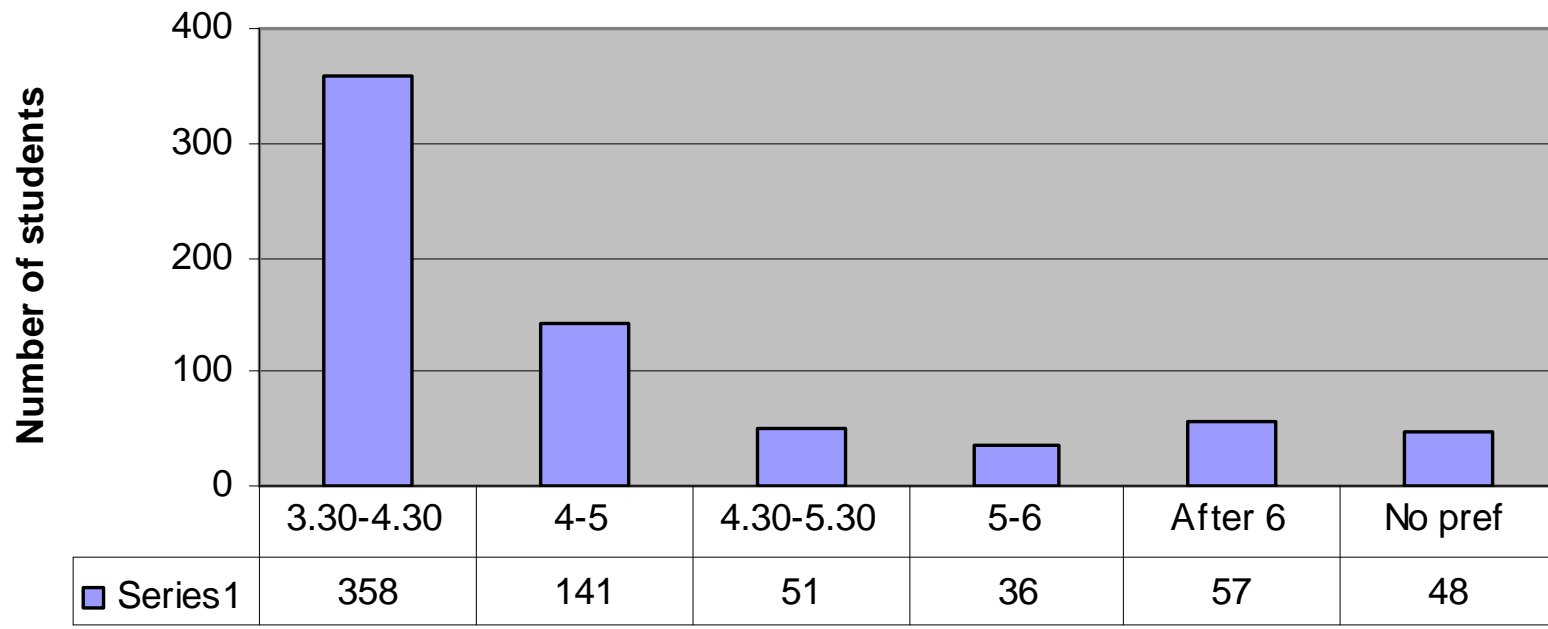


How would you feel about staff taking part?

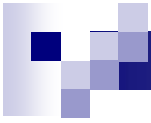




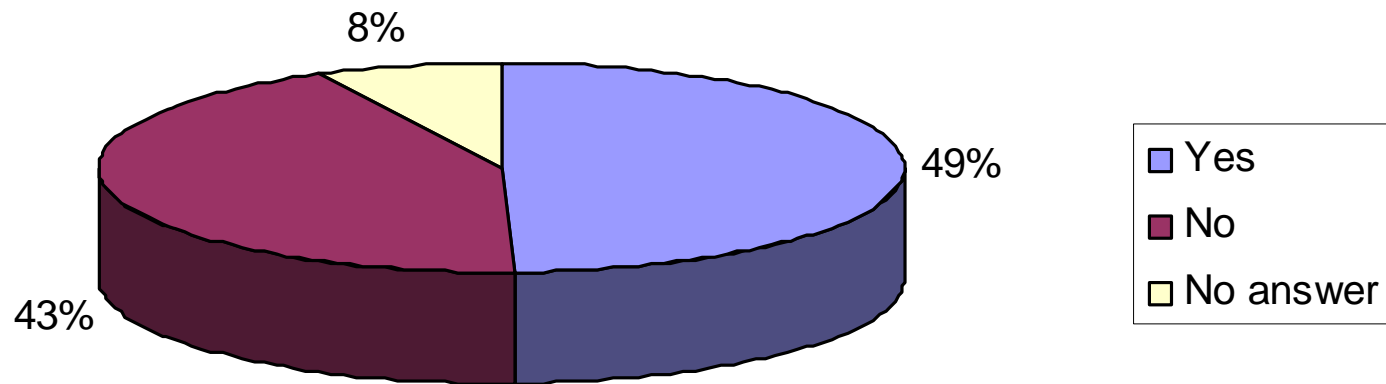
What would be your preferred start and finish times?

Conclusions

- 53% of students were not aware of the Enrichment Activities. This could be one reason for the poor uptake.
- 2% of students are participating in Enrichment Activities. This is surprising because the Federation is not organising these cross school activities.
- The most popular reasons for not being involved in the Enrichment Activities included (in order): not knowing any students; not being interested in the activities offered; having other after school activities; travelling to another school; and not knowing any teachers. Some of these worries are easier to address than others.
- There are a wide variety of activities that students are interested in participating in.
- 61% of students want the Enrichment Activities to take place all year round.
- 69% feel OK about staff taking part in the Enrichment Activities.
- The most popular starting times for the Enrichment Activities are: 3.30-4.30; and 4-5.
- 49% of students would be interested in participating in activities on Saturdays and in the holidays.



Implications for the future

- Student Awareness
 - This needs to be increased so all students know about the Enrichment Activity Programme.
 - Using a more systematic way.
- Reasons for non-participation
 - Perhaps a buddying system could be organised so students do not feel as if they will know no one.
 - The activities must be ones that the students have expressed an interest in.
 - Travel plans must be made clear so they do not concern the students.
- Organisation of the activities
 - Most students want the activities to take place all year.
 - Most students are OK about staff participating.
 - The most popular times are 3.30-4.30.
 - There is interest in Saturday and holiday activities.
